His sound is "soul hybrid" a combination of traditional jazz with modern rhythm and blues. Kenny has performed throughout the United States, Europe, and South Africa as a solo artist and sideman. And, he has performed in Somerset at our Jazz Festivals and at an exhibit opening in the galleries.

What does Somerfest mean to Laurel Arts? What does Somerfest mean to the community?

In last month's newsletter, I wrote about all the great things we had planned for Somerfest. And, they were great ... the music was fabulous, the children's area was enchanting, the vendors had lovely products and scrumptious food for sale.

Our staff and volunteers did an extraordinary job of pulling off this community festival. Honestly, I can't find words to express what a great job they did.

Unfortunately, it was approaching 90 degrees every day of Somerfest, and the news media (even Gov. Wolf) were advising people to stay home. And, it would seem that a lot of them did just that ... they stayed home.

Truth be told, our numbers were down from 2018, and it means we, as an organization, need to evaluate what Somerfest means to Laurel Arts and what it means to the community.

For Laurel Arts, Somerfest has been an opportunity to bring people to our beautiful grounds, it has given local bands an opportunity to perform in a festival atmosphere, it has introduced festival-goers to bands they might not get to hear otherwise (the jazz group *Channel Cats* from Cumberland, MD, for example), it has showcased artists and craftspeople, and it has introduced families to everything Laurel Arts has to offer (not just at Somerfest, but throughout the year.) And, yes, there was a time when it was also our major fundraiser.

For the community, Somerfest has been a reunion, a party, a place to bring the entire family to spend the day. Somerfest has been a summer tradition. By my count, four generations have attended.

In this age of instant communication, do we need to venture out and reunite? In this age of streaming entertainment 24/7, do we need to listen to live music? In this age when even children need a daily planner, do we need a place where they can come and chase giant bubbles?

Of course we do.

It takes a phenomenal amount work on the part of our staff to make Somerfest happen; it takes a large financial commitment from our sponsors; it takes many, many volunteer hours. When our numbers are down it is both disappointing and discouraging. It would be easy to quit. But, we will regroup and do it all again next year.

Musical Theatre is back and so is Miss Bethany!

We are excited to welcome back Bethany Thomas to our dance program. Not only will Bethany be teaching regular dance classes, she will also be teaching musical theatre dance. Two levels will be offered.

Musical Theatre Dance 2—Focusing on popular dance styles used by ensembles in Musical Theatre Productions, this class will instruct students in how to be part of an ensemble that is acting as well as dancing. Students will study and focus on the vitality of storytelling in dance, exploring recent musicals, dance styles, and choreographers from Broadway, Chicago, and London's West End. The class will conclude with a recital dance that emulates a musical ensemble number.

Prior dance and/or acting experience is needed (basic ballet, lyrical, tap, jazz or prior theatre arts classes.) This class will meet from 8 to 9 p.m. Mondays beginning August 19 and is designed for students 11-17.

Musical Theatre Dance 1—This class will be offered from noon to 12:45 p.m. Saturdays beginning August 24. It is designed for students 5-10. Musical Theatre Dance 1 will introduce young students to storytelling while dancing. There will be an emphasis on acting within the dance (this is NOT an acting class, rather an acting while dancing class) which will be accomplished through the use of the musical theatre dance genre. Students will learn basic children's numbers from musicals, as well as popular children's ensemble characters in a musical. The class will conclude with a recital dance that is an interpretation of an ensemble number in a musical. This class will prepare students to continue in Musical Theatre Dance 2. Prior experience is not necessary.
