Resources available to public in art library

Books and art are great medicine for curiosity, boredom, wanderlust, and even melancholy. You are in charge of digesting and translating books and art into visions, ideas, and for deciding to follow a trail of information. Books and art will take you somewhere, and will sometimes startle your expectations of the journey.

Staff and volunteers have spent a lot of time reorganizing the library on the second floor at the Dressler Center and the Guild of American Papercutters bookshelf next to the watercooler in the main office. These are not just collections of art books. These libraries are stocked with "toolkits" and "maps" for how to sample an art medium and learn about its history. Two easy chairs and a lamp make the upstairs library a comfortable and inviting place to explore the arts. The library is also used as a room for violin and guitar lessons.

Currently all books are to remain on Laurel Arts premises, but binders are available at each location to write your name and the book title you've enjoyed examining. Eventually a book plate design project will be announced to invite artists to create artwork, "Ex Libris", which will identify the book owner as either Laurel Arts or Guild of American Papercutters.

You are welcome to explore these resources, and to make it a habit to check the book resources while also visiting the art galleries downstairs. And, if your imagination is stirred by what you see, feed your inspiration by signing up in the office for a class or workshop.

FOOTNOTE: We have had several donations of art books and art supplies recently. Some are being utilized in the library and in classes / workshops. Some were available for sale over the holidays. The book sale during First Night netted Laurel Arts \$142. The basket raffle, which included art supplies, netted \$1011. Thank you to both our donors and those who purchased books and raffle tickets.

From the director's desk

Building upon success

This organization is what it is because of the numerous individuals who have helped along the way. So, maybe my goal is not to *develop*, but *build upon* what the staff and board members have created, what our local artists have created, what our members and great community have created.

There are a lot of new projects, ideas, and possibilities in the works for Laurel Arts, but as exciting as that may sound, I wanted to first take a moment to thank you – our supporters, our members, our advocates.

I will always look back at the early days at Laurel Arts with such fondness, as it will always remind me of the enormous amount of hope and support one community has given to me and to this organization. So, in short, thank you.
