# Dorothy Dressler Scholarships recipients appreciate opportunities provided

The Dorothy Dressler Scholarship Fund was established to honor a great lady and benefactor of Laurel Arts. Mrs. Dressler and her husband Philip purchased a home in Somerset in 1968. They lived there until Philip's death in 1973. Three years later, in honor of her late husband, Dorothy deeded the property to Laurel Arts.

Laurel Arts celebrated the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts with a garden party in July 1996. In recognition for all she had done for Laurel Arts, the Board developed a scholarship fund in her name. Board members each made a contribution to seed the fund. The announcement was made at the party; and Mrs. Dressler immediately wrote a check for \$5,000.

During her remaining years (Mrs. Dressler died in 2005), she continued to make contributions to the scholarship fund, as did her daughters.

The purpose of the Dorothy Dressler Scholarship is to provide families who have financial need the opportunity to participate in Laurel Arts programming. We continue to fund scholarships through our annual golf tournament and with proceeds from Rhythms of Christmas. This year, we have awarded over \$15,000 in scholarships to students attending our dance and/or preschool programs.

These are excerpts from several scholarship applications.

*Tristann:* Dancing helps raise my self-esteem. It makes me feel good about myself. Participating in dance helps to make me feel more confident.

Kynslee's mom: With Kynslee having Asperger's, this (preschool and dance) will teach her how to act in a classroom and to follow the rules, how to function without her dad, sister and me ... to shine on her own!

*Molly:* This is my 14th year of dance. Dance has helped me to gain confidence, learn and improve motor skills, balance and coordination. Dance has helped me with anxiety and sensory issues, as well as depression ... providing me with an amazing sense of community and family.

*Alexa:* Without dance, I would not be the person that I am today and will take these skills and experiences with me and to heart.

Caroline: I'm so grateful that my mom signed me up for dance three years ago, and I never want to take it for granted. Dance has made an enormous impact on my life.

*Kaydence's mom:* My oldest child was part of the (preschool) program and it helped prepare her for the school years to come. The structure children develop from this program is wonderful.

This school year, our scholarship program is assisting 26 students with dance and/or preschool tuition. Some of these children are being raised by grandparents, some families have had health or job related issues that have significantly reduced their family income. We ask our recipients to give back by volunteering their time to help with fundraisers and other Laurel Arts activities.

Many thanks to those of you who participate in the golf tournament and donate at Rhythms of Christmas! Please know that your contributions are appreciated and make a difference.

#### 5-6:30 p.m. Wednesdays beginning November 13


