
### **Gallery Committee makes donations**

In March, Laurel Arts' Gallery Committee hosted its third annual Soup'er Bowl. The purpose of the event is to bring people together through art, a simple meal of soup and bread, and to bring awareness to the fight against hunger.

In August, the committee was finally able to present proceeds of the event to The Humane Society of Somerset County and the Somerset County Mobile Food Bank. The event raised close to \$3,000, which was split equally among the organizations and Laurel Arts' clay studio. The clay studio uses the funds to replenish the clay and glazes which will be used to make the bowls for the next Soup'er Bowl.




### Celebrate the end of summer

- Laurel Arts Dance: The new dance year will begin the week of September 21. Classes are offered for children as young as three through high school. Dance disciplines include ballet, tap, jazz, lyrical and hip hop. NEW THIS YEAR is Theatre Dance. The class is perfect for students who participate in high school musicals.

Musical Theatre Dance 2 (for students 11-17) will seek to strengthen students' acting and dancing while performing by using the genre of dance that is Musical Theatre. Focusing on popular dance styles used by ensembles in Musical Theatre Productions, this class will instruct students how to "be in an ensemble" acting while dancing. Students will study and focus on the vitality of storytelling in dance. We will explore recent musicals, dance styles, and choreographers from Broadway, Chicago, and London's West End. The class will conclude with a recital dance that emulates a Musical Ensemble dance number. No prior dance and/or acting experience is needed. Just a love of Musical Theatre!

Musical Theatre Dance 1 (for students 5-10) will introduce young students to storytelling while dancing. There will be an emphasis on acting within the dance (this is NOT an acting class, rather an acting while dancing class) which will be accomplished through the use of the Musical Theatre dance genre. Students will learn basic children's numbers from musicals, as well as popular children's ensemble characters in a musical. The class will conclude with a recital dance that is an interpretation of an Ensemble number in a musical. This class will prepare students to continue in Musical Theatre Dance 2.
