






Upcoming exhibits to feature regional artists

Laurel Arts is excited to present three outstanding shows that will fill the galleries at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts through early August.

Uncommon Threads opens April 6 and will be on exhibit through May 4. The show grew out of the Common Threads symposium held for several years at Somerset Historical Center. Works will display craftsmanship, creativity and skills which convey the beauty of all areas of Fiber Arts, and may include examples of basketry, weaving, tapestry, coiling, knitting, crochet, embroidery, lacemaking, rug-braiding, rug-hooking, macramé, textile arts, quilting, spinning, papermaking, or any creative combination of the above. Along the Path and Around the Bend by Christopher Boring presents a continuation of a series started seven years ago featuring a mix of brand new and previously exhibited artwork. This show opens May 11 and will be on display through June 10. Boring's work depicts images of rocks and wood through still life paintings. The rocks and wood symbolize and represent memories, moments or thoughts about the artist's life. While most of the work focuses on particular memories, a lot of his recent work centers around the emotions those memories stir up. Joy, peace, anger, and sadness are linked to each moment and are, at times, some of the clearest parts of the memories.

Building Bridges, Laurel Arts 11th Triennial, asks artists to communicate the theme with their work. These pieces may reflect a spirit of uniting people, places, ideas, or suggest a particular concern for divisions the artist recognizes. The triennial will be exhibited from June 22 through August 5. March is Women's History Month, so we thought we'd introduce you to a few of our dance alumnae who have made history in the dance world.

Miranda (Zimmerman) Spada

lives in Buffalo, NY with her husband and two dogs, but she was graduated from North Star High School in 2008. Miranda was our very first Rhythms of Christmas choreographer, and was both Somerset County and Pennsylvania's Outstanding Young Woman for 2008.

Miranda received her BFA in dance from the University of Buffalo. She teaches full-time at Tonawanda Dance Arts and is also the competition director. She has created and directs her own mentorship program for dancers at the studio, LEADS – Learning to Exceed and Aspire Through Dance.

This former Laurel Arts dancer is also an adjudicator with Impact Dance Adjudicators and Platinum National Dance Competition which provides her the opportunity to travel all over the country as a guest instructor and judge.

Joanie (Johnson) Rubin credits her professional movement career to the passion and instruction that was instilled in her as a student at Laurel Arts.

She was graduated from Slippery Rock University in 2004 with a BA in Dance and moved to NYC. Festival (San Francisco), Piel Morena Contemporary Dance (Chicago), Collage Youth Ensemble (Memphis), and Alonzo King LINES Ballet Training Program (San Francisco). Angela also has worked closely in collaboration with Ahmad Simmons/Pursuit Productions and Princess Grace Award recipient Joshua Manulich to create, perform, and stage their works.

Additional credits include appearances in Summit Entertainment's Sorority Row and The New York Times bestseller Dancers Among Us, by photographer Jordan Matter. She is the creator of a series of short video works under the title "There is a season for everything," documented in Northern Virginia where she resides with her husband and two sons.
