# Boring-Mayak to present joint show

Christopher Boring is a Pittsburgh based artist; Bridget Mayak is one of Laurel Arts' gallery committee members. Kathy Trexel Reed, another gallery committee member, said, "Mayak's earthy clay pieces and welded sculptures will be great partners for Boring's work. His oils are often as organic as rocks and zen-like cracks in the ground."

They will exhibit at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts May 11 through June 10. An opening reception is planned (tentatively) for 6 to 8 p.m. Friday, May 21.

Boring received his BFA in Drawing and Painting from Edinboro University in 2012. He resides in Pittsburgh with his wife and fellow painter Heather Heitzenrater and their two cats. His studio is located in the neighborhood of Homewood and is part of the Radiant Hall Studios at 7800 Susquehanna Ave.

His work has been shown nationally, and at the State Museum of Pennsylvania, Hoyt Art Center in New Castle and Academy Center of the Arts in Lynchburg, VA.

Boring has won awards, given artist talks, and participated in several art festivals. He is also an active member of Associated Artists of Pittsburgh and Pittsburgh Society of Artists.

Bridget Mayak holds a bachelor's degree in Art Education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, which is where she first developed her love of pottery and sculpture. Mayak taught art for 40 years in the Somerset Area School District, touching the lives of over 8,000 students!

Her clay work consists predominantly of functional pottery and whimsical clay sculpture; her metal sculptures are assembled from found objects and scrap steel. She also combines the two media in specialty pieces and garden totems.

In 2009, Mayak was named Pennsylvania's Outstanding Elementary Art Teacher of the Year by the Pennsylvania Art Education Association. She was chosen as Touchstone's Artist of the Year in 2010.

Mayak's work has been exhibited at Touchstone Center for Crafts in Farmington, Fallingwater, Bottleworks in Johnstown, and at Laurel Arts, where she has won Best of Show and numerous other awards.

She recently exhibited in an alumni show, entitled 60s, 70s, and 80s Artist Legacy of IUP. She is a juried artisan for the Handmade Along the Highway program sponsored by the Lincoln Highway Association and sells her work at shops throughout western Pennsylvania.
