

Making it work Annual dance recital WILL happen May 29

Believe me, this is big news ... Laurel Arts Dance WILL have a recital this month, and it will be in an auditorium!

We have a saying at the dance center, "We make it work." And, that's what we've been doing for 14 months. As you know, we had to be closed from mid-March through mid-June 2020, so we regrouped, rehearsed and redesigned last year's annual recital. It was held outdoors at Georgian Place in mid-August, and it worked!

Until mid-March of 2021, we weren't sure where we would be able to present our annual show. We had been investigating outdoor venues, tent rentals, and stage options. On March 23, we received approval to have our recital in the Rockwood Area School auditorium! The board and staff at Rockwood have been wonderful, and we are very appreciative.

We still have to limit ticket sales to 75% capacity; and we have choreographed our finale so that only one class at a time will be on stage. The audience will wear masks, as will our students unless they are on stage. But, we will at least be approaching a normal recital experience!

The 2020-21 dance year was a bit shorter than usual. We didn't start until mid-September, and we were closed for December and part of January. We had to record our annual *Rhythms of Christmas* show in February (without an audience), but we did produce an entertaining video that was provided to several nursing homes and schools for their viewing pleasure.

Our performance company attended two dance competitions and qualified for Nationals!

Overall, although we had a few pandemic-related set-backs, we have had a good year; we've provided our students with opportunities to grow as dancers and enjoy the fellowship that is only possible when we get together in person and in the dance studio! We will also say goodbye to five seniors.

On behalf of the board of Laurel Arts, I want to thank our dedicated staff, volunteers, dancers and parents for "making it ALL work!"

Our new dance year will begin in late August, and we are accepting registrations now. We offer classes for children as young as three years old. Preschoolers and children in early elementary (K-3) may enroll in a combo class that provides instruction in ballet, tap and creative movement or jazz. In addition, acro and hip hop classes are available.

As students progress, they may select the styles of dance they prefer (although we do require ballet). We are also happy to accommodate older students who haven't danced before.

Children and adults with special needs also have a place in our hearts and in our dance program.

week of August 16-20. Camp fee for three-day sessions is \$32 for members of Laurel Arts; \$40 for non-members. The camp fee for five-day sessions is \$40 for members; \$50 for non-members.

Young at ART is for children Pre-K through 3rd grade. These are our traditional five-day, full-day camps. Students will use lots of art media to create projects, will make delicious snacks, and will participate in fun themebased games. These camps are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Camp fees are \$80 for members of Laurel Arts; \$100 for non-members.
