# Laurel Arts presents **Building Bridges**

Laurel Arts is excited to present its 11th Triennial Juried Art Exhibit. This year's theme is *Building Bridges*. Artists from throughout the region are showing works that reflect a spirit of uniting people, places, ideas or suggest through their work their concerns about divisiveness.

The triennial will occupy the galleries through August 5. It is a juried show, and the exhibiting artists have worked in a variety of mediums.

Diane Kelly, artist and owner of Firesong Studio, near Bedford, was the juror for the show. She has an extensive background in graphic arts and fine arts. She has exhibited work in various galleries, served as a juror at the Torpedo Factory Art Center in Alexandria, VA, writes for and has worked as a technical editor for Interweave Press, contributing to both Handwoven magazine and various other books.

An opening reception is scheduled for 6 to 8 p.m. Friday, July 2. The public is invited to attend, meet the artists, and enjoy an evening out.

Galleries are also open Monday through Thursday from noon to 6 p.m. and during special events.

### Reflections of the Human Spirit

### Laurel Arts to host a month-long 9-11 exhibition

A poignantly clear blue sky. A crisp September morning. The world revolved upon its axis as it normally had — children took the bus to school, the morning news covered yesterday's events, and the day was one of those perfect late summer, not quite fall days that we know so well in our neck of the woods.

That same morning, 40 passengers and crew members boarded United Airlines Flight 93. We all know the unfortunate events that would follow; the attack aboard Flight 93 would result in those passengers and crew members becoming known as heroes thereafter. The bucolic green-laden rolling hills of Somerset County would become a final resting place, and our area would be impacted in a profoundly unique and unimaginable way.

The morning of September 11, 2001 suddenly became a moment of tragedy in our Nation's history. The stable axis of our world suddenly felt like it had suffered a paradigm shift, wherein the fundamental makeup of our lives seemed all but shattered.

In the moments that would follow the crash of United Flight 93, local fire departments, emergency response units, and members of our communities jumped into action; they responded without question to an act of terror, because from what I have been told, "it's just what they do."

Somerset County was suddenly the scene of an attack on the core foundations of our Nation's freedom and how did we respond – with fearless heroism, tenacity, unity, grit, and an embrace of sympathy and steadfastness for the families of the 40 fallen heroes that would span decades. President George W. Bush coined the phrase, *America's County*, because he witnessed the response, unity, and sense of community that defines the people of this area. Many individuals from Somerset County came together and restored a sense of hope and perseverance after one of the most tragic days in history and as residents of this area, we should be proud of those efforts put forth by so many local individuals.

This September, Laurel Arts will host a month-long exhibition entitled, **Reflections** of the Human Spirit - America's County Responds to the Tragic Events of September 11th. The exhibition will host artifacts from the National Park Service, local fire departments, and first response agencies, as well as photography, artwork, audio & video files, images of Somerset County, and artistic symbols of hope's endurance during such tragedy. A performance will be held on the evening of September 11 by members of the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra, wherein pieces written exclusively for this event will be performed. In addition, there will be guest speakers (authors and local community members) and additional performances by local musicians scheduled throughout the month of September.

Twenty years removed from a day that we must never forget, my hope is that this exhibition will serve as a reflection of our County - that we answered the call without hesitation, that the members of our communities embraced one another, that there was hope for a better tomorrow, because we saw first-hand what people can achieve when they work together. People of this County get things done, we have grit, we have tenacity, and I believe that is something that we should all be proud of and make us even more proud to say that YES, we live in Somerset County!



# Triennial award winners to be recognized






