Alan Luther Miller, 81, of Somerset, died June 12 at The Patriot. Alan and his wife Lana have been long-time supporters of Laurel Arts.

Alan was born January 19, 1941 in Somerset. He was the son of Luther P. and Mary (Bittner) Miller. He was preceded in death by his parents and daughter-in-law Gayle Miller, and is survived by his wife, the former Lana Jean Maurer to whom he was married 60 years, children Troy A. Plan now to attend these special fall workshops

Handmade Paper Workshop

SATURDAY, SEPT. 24, 2022, 10 AM – 4 PM

During this all-day workshop, participants will learn paper making from self-taught paper maker Katy DeMent (www.thepaperlady.com). Students will have a crash course in building equipment and making pulps from plants and recycled fibers, while creating handmade paper sheets with a variety of embellishments including color, texture and collage.



Here is what the day's schedule will look like:

10 am – Intro to paper making; sharing examples, brief history of communication and the history of paper making, prep materials

10:30 am – Do you want to make personal molds to take home for future paper making? (materials cost \$35 each for this or we just use mine)

11 am – Making and dyeing pulps from natural and reclaimed materials and fibers, sharing examples of plant fiber varieties

Noon – Sheet forming with texture color and random inclusions

12:30 pm - Press and hang up to dry

1 to 1:30 pm - Short lunch break

1:30 pm – Collage ... participants may create handmade papers in a larger format while designing a wet on wet collage (can include vintage items from home)

3 pm – How to "depost" and get it all home to dry.

The fee for this all-day workshop is \$68 members / \$85 nonmembers payable to Laurel Arts. Pre-registration is required by September 1. Call or text 814-442-6217 or call Laurel Arts at 814-443-1835 to register. Class takes place at 601 Georgian Place.

Wool Braided Rug Workshop

BEGINNING TUESDAY, SEPT. 20, 2022, 1 – 2 PM BEGINNING TUESDAY, SEPT. 20, 2022, 6 – 7 PM

Instructor Lisa Meyers will be offering another of her beautiful rug making classes this fall. This is a class that teaches a machine free, gadget free, ancient method of making braided rugs. Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem solving skills needed to create a quality rug. Since this is a craft, the skills will be developed in each student according to their needs. The "Art" part is in the selection of color combinations.

The first lesson is one hour or so to go over all the proper materials, needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important and can not be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions.

***Please do not buy any materials ahead of this lesson. After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing any materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee.

You may start a 3' X 5' rug or a 10" X 16" place mat. Either will give you the knowledge and experience to make as many rugs as your heart desires!

First class takes place on Tuesday, September 20 at 1pm to 2pm. **The following 4 classes** will be September 27, October 4, 11, and 18 from 1 to 3:30 pm. (She will also be offering an evening class from 6 to 8:30 pm on the same dates.)

Cost for the class is \$52 members / \$65 nonmembers. Fees for materials are not included in the cost. Preregistration is required. Call Laurel Arts at 814-443-2433 or text/call 814-442-6217 to register. Class takes place at 601 Georgian Place, Somerset. Former students welcome to visit, show off your work or ask a question.
