# Coming soon ... Soup'er Bowl & Wild About Bags

Soup'er Bowl 2023 will be held from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday, March 18 at the Laurel Arts Education & Dance Center, 601 Georgian Place. The event is modeled after the popular Empty Bowls dinners that take place worldwide to fundraise for food-related charities in order to raise awareness and help end hunger.

Admission is \$20 and tickets are only available at the door. Price of admission includes a simple meal of soup, bread, a cookie and a beverage. Attendees will also select a unique, handmade clay bowl to take home to serve as a reminder that "Soup feeds the body, but ART feeds the soul!"

The soups and cookies are being donated by several local restaurants, and the clay bowls were handmade by the Mud Ladies, local artists/art teachers who volunteer their time and talents to make this special event happen. All proceeds are split between Laurel Arts and a local food pantry or similar charity.

### LAEDC will remain at 601 Georgian Place

Somerset Trust Co. announced in November that it will be purchasing 80,000 square feet of Georgian Place property, including several office buildings, as part of a move to consolidate offices and bring several hundred employees under one roof.

The purchase does not affect Laurel Arts Education and Dance Center at 601 Georgian Place. Laurel Arts purchased the space in 2009. We are part of a condominium association that oversees maintenance, etc. of the "600 building" at Georgian Place.

"A number of the buildings (not included in the sale) are owner-occupied and I think they'll complement what we're trying to do," Somerset Trust Vice President of Marketing Allison Hoffman said. In addition to Laurel Arts Education and Dance Center, there are several other owner-occupied spaces that are not included in the sale.

According to Somerset Trust CEO Sean Cook, the company views the move as an opportunity to create a modern work space that will fit employees' changing needs.

Developing a headquarters inside the Georgian Place will create opportunities for neighboring businesses. Cook envisions a unique "campus-like community" around the Somerset Trust headquarters — with room for retail, restaurants and complementary tenants.

"When it comes to employee well-being — health and fitness and other services are all huge priorities — and a lot of that is already in place," Hoffman added.

The historic 1915-era mansion that overlooks Somerset Lake is also not included in the purchase.

Laurel Arts is excited at the prospect of being a part of this new development as we move forward with developing more arts opportunities for area residents.
