Soup'er Bowl 2023 will be held from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday, March 18 at Laurel Arts Education & Dance Center, 601 Georgian Place. The event is modeled after the popular Empty Bowls dinners that take place worldwide to fundraise for food-related charities in order to raise awareness and help end hunger.

Admission is \$20 and tickets are only available at the door. Admission includes a simple meal of soup, bread, a cookie and a beverage. Attendees

will also select a unique, handmade clay bowl to take home to serve as a reminder that "Soup feeds the body, but ART feeds the soul!"

The soups and cookies are being donated by several local restaurants, and the clay bowls were handmade by the Mud Ladies, local artists/art teachers who volunteer their time and talents to make this special event happen. All proceeds are split between Laurel Arts and a local food pantry or similar charity.

Photos will be exhibited at the art center from May 16 through June 8.

Cash prizes will be awarded for first, second and third places as well as Best of Show. Categories are: Scenic, Floral, Fauna & Birds, People, Digital Art and Alternative Processes, Black & White, and Nighttime with a maximum of two entries per category. All prints must be 11 x 14 inches; smaller prints must be matted to 11 x 14. The preceding dimensions do not include the frame. All entries must be framed and have a horizontal wire on the back for hanging. (Digital matting is acceptable.)

Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem solving skills needed to

create a quality rug. Since this is a craft, the skills will be developed in each student according to their needs. The "Art" part is in the selection of color combinations.

The first lesson is one hour or so to go over all the proper materials, needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important session and cannot be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions.

***Please do not buy any materials ahead of this lesson. After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing any materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee.

You may start a 3' X 5' rug or a 10" X 16" place mat. Either will give you the knowledge and experience to make as many rugs as your heart desires!

First class takes place from 1 to 2 p.m. Tuesday, March 7. We will not meet on March 14. This will give students an extra week to gather supplies. The following four classes will be from 1 to 3:30 p.m. March 21, 28, April 4 and 11. (She will also be offering an evening class from 6 to 8:30 p.m. on the same dates.)

Cost for the class is \$52 members/\$65 nonmembers. Fees for materials are not included in the cost. Preregistration is required. Art Explorers (12-18 months)

Introducing art to young children can help build fine motor skills, promote creativity, prepare them for writing, and so much more. Through themed workshops, little artists will be introduced to many different art media. They will also play games, create snacks, read stories, and more! We ask that parents stay with their children as they create and explore. Workshops are 90 minutes each for two days. Tuition is \$24 members of Laurel Arts / \$30 non-members.

FAIRYTALE CAMP: 10-11:30 am June 8 & 9. Decorate a gingerbread house for Hansel & Gretel, bake an apple treat for Snow White, and plant some magic beans like Jack. This week we'll read some magical fairytales and create snacks, games, and crafts to go with them.

UNDER THE BIG TOP: 10-11:30 am June 29 & 30. Join us for the Greatest Camp on Earth under the big top at Laurel Arts. Make snow cones and candy apples, craft your own unique clown, and try your hand at walking on stilts.

COLORS CAMP: 10-11:30 am August 17 & 18. We will use a rainbow of shades to craft, take part in a scavenger hunt, and create some colorful snacks. We will also mix things up a bit to make some new colors.

Art Adventurers (18-36 months)

Each session lasts two hours and is filled with art projects designed for small artists. Participants will have a chance to experiment with creativity while enhancing fine motor skills. Our sessions are not just limited to art but also include games, stories, and cooking/baking. Choose a three-day morning session or a five-day afternoon session. We ask that children who are not

potty trained be accompanied by an adult. Tuition is (3-day Session) \$35 members / \$44 non-members; (5-day session) \$48 members / \$60 non-members
