Common Threads to be Saturday, April 22 at Historical Center

Laurel Arts and Somerset Historical Center are partnering to present our annual **Common Threads Fiber Arts Symposium** from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, April 22 at Somerset Historical Center. Regional fiber artists will be set up throughout the day demonstrating a wide variety of historical and contemporary fiber arts techniques, selling their handmade products, and providing hands-on activities for participants.

Lindsay Ketterer Gates will be the keynote speaker at this year's symposium. She is the executive director of Touchstone Center for Crafts and an accomplished fiber artist. Her work is in the permanent collection of the American Embassy in the Republic of Djibouti, The Museum of Art and Design in New York City, and the Yale University Art Gallery, as well as other international collections. She's been featured on the cover of Metalsmith Magazine and on the pages of American Craft Magazine, FiberArts, Fiber Art Now, Surface Design Journal, and Shuttle, Spindle and Dyepot Magazine.

The backdrop for the symposium is the Visitor's Center at Somerset Historical Center. The museum tells the story of farm life in southwestern Pennsylvania.



Lunch will be available for purchase from Fat Squirrel. The symposium is open to the public. Admission is \$5. Act 48 credits are available for teachers.

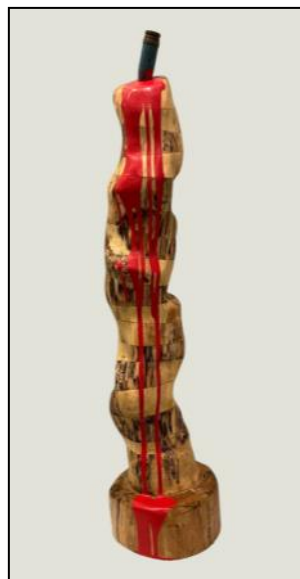
