6 p.m. Sunday, June 18 (Father's Day) will feature Somerset County Community Band & ice cream social (see story.)



The show is open to all visual artists 18 and older. Each artist may submit up to three entries for a non-refundable entry fee of \$20. The work must have been executed within the last two years, and cannot have been exhibited in a previous show at Laurel Arts. At least one piece of work must be offered for sale.
