Laurel Arts will once again transform the galleries at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts during the month of October. *Haunted: The Sequel* will showcase the art forms of special effects makeup, fabrication and monster making, prop making, and other skillful techniques used in the world of the Haunt.

Are you a Special Effects Makeup Artist, Monster Maker, Fabricator, and/or a Prop Maker? A call for entries is available at laurelarts.org/artist-call-for-entries/ to view and download. A maximum of 6 pieces may be entered; entry fee is \$25 for 1 to 3 pieces; \$35 for 4 to 6 pieces. At least one half of entries by any artist must be for sale.

Drop-off is from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesday and Thursday, October 4 and 5, and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, October 7. Two-D pieces must be wired and ready for hanging. There are no size restrictions for free-standing pieces except to note that some doorways are only 32 inches wide and there are several steps to maneuver.

The exhibit will run from October 10 through November 2. An opening reception is planned from 6 to 8 p.m. Friday, October 13 with certain creepy crawly, but not nasty nor nauseating foods and beverages of which (not witch) our ghoulish visitors may partake. A related event, Haunted Arts, will be held October 14 with a variety of activities for children and adults.

Artists, animal lovers: This exhibit is for you!

Laurel Arts is excited to present **Don't Feed the Art**, an exhibit of art featuring animals from man's best friend to man-eating sharks. We are looking for artists to create pieces in 2-D and 3-D. A maximum of 6 entries per artists will be accepted. Entry fee is \$25 for 1 to 3 pieces; \$35 for 4 to 6 pieces. Two-D pieces must be wired and ready for hanging. There are no size restrictions for free-standing pieces except to note that some doorways are only 32 inches wide and there are several steps to maneuver.


Take time to explore The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts



Wood Braided Rug Workshop

Beginning Wednesdays October 4, afternoon & evening classes available

Instructor Lisa Meyers will be offering another one of her beautiful rug making classes this spring. This is a class that teaches a machine free, gadget free, ancient method of making braided rugs. Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem solving skills needed to create a quality rug. Since this is a craft, the skills will be developed in each student according to their needs. The "Art" part is in the selection of color combinations.

The first lesson is one hour or so to go over all the proper materials, needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important and can not be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions. Please do not buy any materials ahead of this lesson. After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing any materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee.


