Tribute added to Imagination Garden

"It takes a big heart to shape little minds." As an organization, we know this to be true from the constant examples of dedication, care, and passion our teachers have for education and working with even the youngest of students.

Over the summer, we learned of the passing of one of Laurel Arts' former preschool educators, Jennifer Galbreth. Jennifer taught at Laurel Arts preschool when it went by the name of the "Creative Playroom" and was offered at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts in the 1980s and 1990s.

In memory of Jennifer, and as tribute to the lasting positive impact she had on so many children who attended the program, their families, and her coworkers, an outdoor musical instrument was purchased and installed in Laurel Arts' Imagination Garden.

This beautiful memorial was made possible through the kindness of Pam Morocco and others who donated funds in support of the musical instrument in Jennifer's memory.

We were honored to welcome Jennifer's family members and friends to the garden to share in a moment of enjoyment of the memories and love that Jennifer had for those around her and her passion for education.

They were popularized in French bakeries during the 19th century where they got their other common name, Bûche de Noël. Students will mix,

Mosaics Workshop for Beginners

Wednesday, March 6, 13, 20, 27, April 3, 10, 17, 24

Mosaics for Beginners is a class for those who are interested in learning how to create art by mortaring or gluing pieces of tesserae (material) onto another object or substrate. We will discuss what mosaics are and view many different styles and methods of mosaics. Students will be introduced to the classic mosaic hammer and hardie in order to cut local materials such as sandstone, limestone, and coal as well as reclaimed materials such as pottery and glass. Students will also learn to use tile snips as well as glass snips. Students will even be introduced to imported Italian smalti glass that is seen on cathedrals throughout the world. The class will cover how to mix mortar and epoxy, how to build a substrate, and how to apply tesserae in flowing lines of andamento (movement). Class takes place for eight weeks from 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesdays March 6, 13, 20, 27, April 3, 10, 17, 24 at 601 Georgian Place, Somerset.

The cost for the workshop is \$76.80 members / \$96 nonmembers plus a \$25 materials fee payable to Laurel Arts. Registration is required. Our new payment policy requires students to pay 50% of the total tuition and materials upon registration. This is non-refundable.
