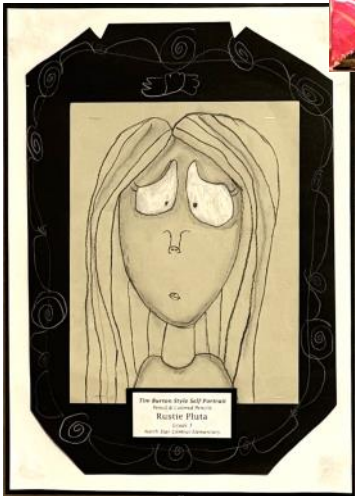

Plan a visit to see ...**The Guild of American Papercutters National Museum
(Yes, it's right here in Somerset!)**

Laurel Arts is proud to be the home of The Guild Of American Papercutters National Museum, the only one of its kind in the United States. The Guild of American Papercutters (GAP) was founded in 1988 by a group of papercut art enthusiasts, meeting for the first time at the Hershey Museum of American. GAP is a nonprofit organization dedicated to papercutting and paper work as an art form in all its historical and contemporary styles. By its 10th anniversary, GAP had over 500 members located in 48 states and 16 other countries. Members range from beginner to highly skilled amateur and professional full-time artists and teachers, papercutting enthusiasts, researchers, historians, and collectors. Membership is welcomed — the Guild has no jury requirements and conducts no competitive art contests.

In 2009, 21 years after its founding, members established The National Museum of the Guild of American Papercutters in affiliation with Laurel Arts at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts. This is the first American museum devoted to papercutting as an art form. The museum has a permanent collection of papercuts as well as changing exhibitions.

The National Museum of the Guild of American Papercutters continues to build a permanent collection of work created by papercut artists of all times and places, donated by members and well-wishers. Housing over 200 carefully chosen and curated paper artworks, the core collection has been amassed over the years from member exhibits at the Museum as well as individual donations; the substantial gift that is the McDaniel Papercut Collection contains 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st century artworks in paper.

This summer, GAP is going to the Adirondacks! Members will have the opportunity to exhibit their talents from June 1 to July 21, 2024 in an exhibition at View Arts Center in Old Forge, NY. The theme for this exhibition will be Paper Trails. What might you see on an Adirondack trail?

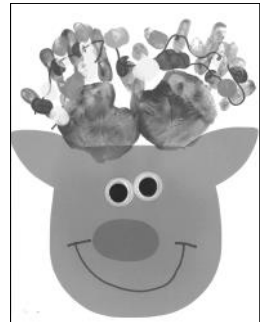

Would you like to learn to crochet? Join Instructor Tami Skavang for a 4-week session and learn the basics. Tami will show students a variety of stitches including chain stitch, single crochet, double crochet, triple crochet, and half double crochet. Learn to read patterns and what the crochet abbreviations mean so you can continue to crochet on your own after the classes. Work each week to complete a beautiful project of your choice. Students with experience can also attend to get help with a pattern. Classes take place on Wednesdays, February 21, 28, March 6 and 13 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at 601 Georgian Place, Somerset. Mosaics Workshop for Beginners

Wednesday, March 6, 13, 20, 27, April 3, 10, 17, 24

Mosaics for Beginners is an 8-week class for those who are interested in learning how to create art by mortaring or gluing pieces of tesserae (material) onto another object or substrate. We will discuss what mosaics are and view many different styles and methods of mosaics. Students will be introduced to the classic mosaic hammer and hardie in order to cut local materials such as sandstone, limestone, and coal as well as reclaimed materials such as pottery and glass. Students will also learn to use tile snips as well as glass snips. Students will even be introduced to imported Italian smalti glass that is seen on cathedrals throughout the world. The class will cover how to mix mortar and epoxy, how to build a substrate, and how to apply tesserae in flowing lines of andamento (movement). Class takes place for eight weeks from 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesdays March 6, 13, 20, 27, April 3, 10, 17, 24 at 601 Georgian Place, Somerset.

The cost for the workshop is \$76.80 members / \$96 nonmembers plus a \$25 materials fee payable to Laurel Arts. Registration is required. Our new payment policy requires students to pay 50% of the total tuition and materials upon registration. This is non-refundable. Pysanky Egg Workshop

Thursday, March 14, 5-7 pm

Pysanky is a traditional craft originally done in Ukraine and Poland. Join instructor, Alicia Shussett, as she helps you to create one of these beautiful eggs. Students will learn to add patterns using the traditional method

involving wax and various colors of dye. This class is just in time to decorate or to make a gift for someone special for Easter.
