Common Threads is a celebration of all things Fiber Art including basketry, weaving, tapestry, coiling, knitting, crochet, embroidery, lacemaking, rug braiding, rug hooking, macramé, textile arts, silk painting, sewing, quilting, spinning, felting, papermaking, bookbinding, and many creative combinations of those skills. This event offers an opportunity for regional fiber artists to make meaningful connections and share their skills and knowledge with each other as well as the public. Throughout the day, fiber artists will be set up throughout the museum, demonstrating specific techniques, providing hands-on activities to participants, and the artists will be educating visitors when selling or talking about their hand-made products.

The \$5 admission price to Common Threads includes the opportunity to explore the

Somerset County Historical Museum. The keynote speakers are Betsy and Dan Brockett from Foggy Blossom Farm. Foggy Blossom is home to a wide variety of perennial plants, most notably a vast collection of willow for basketry & craft.

Exhibiting artists will have created unique, unusual, off the wall pieces to display throughout our galleries. Instead of walking up to the art, we want you to be able to walk through the art as it is displayed on floors, pedestals, tables, or even hanging from the ceiling.

What do we mean by three-dimensional art? This is art that is presented in the dimensions of height, width, and depth that occupies physical space, and can be perceived from all sides and angles. We anticipate various mediums including wood, stone, metal, plastic, glass, found objects, sculptural, welding, blacksmithing, carvings, castings, installations, reliefs, mixed media, 3-D printing, collages, mosaics, jewelry, pottery, and/or fibers. Piece may be whimsical, abstract, or realistic. Plan to attend the opening or stop by during gallery hours to see these *off the wall* designs.

Wool Braided Rug Workshop

First class April 8, 1-2 pm

Instructor Lisa Meyers will be offering another one of her beautiful rug making classes this spring. This class teaches a machine free, gadget free, ancient method of making braided rugs. Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem solving skills needed to create a quality rug. The first lesson is one hour or so to go over all the proper materials, needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important and can not be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions. Please do not buy any materials ahead of this lesson. After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing any materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee. You may start a 3' X 5' rug or a 10" X 16" place mat. Either will give you the knowledge and experience to make as many rugs as your heart desires!

First class will be from 1 to 2 p.m. Tuesday, April 9. We will take a one week break to allow time to purchase materials. The following four classes will be from 1 to 3:30 p.m. OR 6 to 8:30 p.m. Tuesdays April 23, 30, May 7, 14. Cost for the class is \$52 members / \$65 nonmembers. 11:00 a.m. Making and dyeing pulps from natural and reclaimed materials and fibers, share examples of plant fiber varieties


Line Dancing, 10 to 11 a.m. Saturday mornings
