



New exhibit coming to The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts

Cutting Edge: Contemporary Papercutting at The Guild of American Papercutters National Museum



The National Museum of The Guild of American Papercutters, located on the second floor of The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts, is pleased to announce the upcoming exhibition, Cutting Edge: Contemporary Papercutting, featuring the work of Lorraine Bubar, Béatrice Coron, Hazel Glass, Rebecca Greene, Mark Curtis Hughes, and Swoon. The exhibition will run from October 1 through April 1,

2025. An opening reception will be held Saturday, October 12.

Curated by Puerto Rico based contemporary papercutter Rosa Leff, this exhibition is an opportunity for audiences to experience the mutability of a medium often associated with craft and tradition and recognize its worthiness as a fine art. The unpretentious nature of papercutting no doubt comes from its roots in folk art. However, these masters use the accessibility of the medium to guide an appreciation of detail: a dense crowd or the intricate pattern of a turtle shell.

Stories are slowly revealed as the artists carve their paper with a preferred tool: usually a blade, knife, or scissors. Drawing on their knowledge of papercutting's rich history and their extensive expertise, they wield these humble instruments to create detailed works reflecting the modern world: LA's tangled highways, the ocean's deepest secrets, London's busiest streets, the challenges of motherhood, and so much more.

These works address the process of papercutting, a meticulous excavation of one or many layers of paper,

and its meditative qualities. Glass said, "My knife follows the lines until they've led me to the destination: sunkenrelief sculptures that transport me from everyday anxiety to the enchanting." In the end, the shadows of the cut paper remind us that there is even more to each story.

For Coron the "shadows suggest danger but also opportunities for new adventures."

Visit the exhibit during gallery hours or attend the opening reception October 12. Let your papercutting adventure begin!



A FREE papercutting class is also planned with Artist Wendy Bale from 10 a.m. to noon Saturday, October 12.

Bale will take you step by step through embossing and painting your own realistic rock paper monarch butterfly. In this introduction to Rock Paper you will learn about the unique qualities of this durable mineral paper — yes, it is really made from rocks! While we're crafting, we'll discuss




Visit our galleries, immerse yourself in kindness

The galleries at The Philip Dressler Center for the Arts will be transformed into a colorful, immersive experience where visitors will be greeted with large panels of images, artworks, written materials, experiences, and multi-media that will be used to explore kindness. Laurel Arts will be working with Blue Sky Design Co. of Greensburg once again, as we did with our 9/11 exhibition in 2021. We have already confirmed regional artist Larry Brandstetter for the exhibit. Larry's work is centered around concepts of kindness, peace, and love.

Laurel Arts is currently in conversation with The Fred Rogers Institute to obtain film clips, artifacts, and host workshops at the Dressler Center with their scholars. We will work with the scholars to plan student workshops that will be made available to area school students.

We will host an opening reception on November 16 (time to be announced.) We are also looking to host guest speakers and have a movie night in conjunction with the exhibit. Follow us on Facebook for more details. We will also be asking community members prior to the exhibition, and during, to participate in activities that will be used as an installation in the exhibition.

The exhibit will explore concepts with a goal of inspiring and informing visitors of all ages, reminding us that you can be kind at any age. It's truly not that difficult, even on bad days. It is a mindset that, once adopted, grows and reaches beyond the self.

TapFUNdementals


Saturdays, 9 to 10 am
