## Everybody loves a parade!

Marshall is "fired up" for the 2025 SOCO Summer Parade Friday, July 25. Laurel Arts is the host of the parade which will kick off at 6 p.m. and travel up North Center Avenue to Main Street to Franklin Avenue.

The parade is the start of *Chalk the Block* Weekend (July 25–27) in uptown Somerset.

Uptown Chalk the Block is Western Pennsylvania's first and oldest Street Painting Festival. This year features over 20 professional chalk artists producing work on the sidewalks and streets of uptown. There will also be both emerging and youth chalk artist competitions, live music,

art demonstrations, free kids activities, food and drinks available for purchase, a 5k run/walk, and so much more! For a schedule, visit somersetinc.org/chalktheblock.

Following the parade, make your way to the diamond to hear Matt Otis and The Sound from 7 to 8:30 p.m. The musical stylings of Matt Otis and The Sound will have you dancing in the street - literally!







#### Local artists visit The Ruins Project

SCAA members and friends visited The Ruins Project of rock mosaics Saturday, June 21. Participants carpooled to the site near Perryopolis, where they visited the studio of master-mosaicist Rachel Sager and toured the art installations, guided by historian Erika Johnson's commentaries. Standing walls of the former coal mine have become an international mosaic art gallery, acknowledging the historical value of mining and the perils for mine workers and families.

The Ruins Project is a collaborative mosaic art installation on private property adjacent to Sager Mosaics. It is accessible only via guided tour, and reservations are required. The tour is approximately 75 minutes of easy walking and standing outdoors, and ends with a short mosaic demonstration in Rachel's studio. Public tours are \$25 per person. For more information, visit sagermosaics.com.

Local artist Kathy Reed has contributed mosaic blocks to the project. The Ruins Project includes the work of over 400 artists from 17 countries.

## Wood Burning (Pyrography) Workshop Sunday, July 13, 1-3 pm

We are excited to have Karli Hazlett of Artistry From Scratch in Ebensburg join our talented line up of instructors. Karli will be teaching a class in Pyrography. Also known as wood burning, this is an art form in which designs are created on wood or other materials with a heated tool.

Students will use pyrography pens to burn beautiful designs into their choice of projects: a handmade charcuterie board or a hat, or you can choose your own design! Draw it at the class or send it ahead to have it drawn onto the wood for you. Projects can be taken home that day! This workshop is great for all skill levels. Please specify which project you would like when you call to register.

Charcuterie Board fee is payable to Laurel Arts: \$40 members / \$50 non-members plus a \$25 materials fee.

Hat fee is payable to Laurel Arts: \$64 members / \$80 non-members plus a \$25 materials fee.

Our payment policy requires students to pay 50% of the total tuition and materials upon registration. This is non-refundable. Call/text 814-442-6217 or call 814-443-1835 to register by July 6 so supplies can be ordered in time. Pre-registration is required.

Learn how to make your own chunky knit blanket with Amy Miller of Finnegan Knits in Finzel, MD. This class is a great introduction to knitting because no needles are required, and at the end of the class you will have a lap blanket to call your own! Make your blanket part of your home decor, or use as a gift. All ages eight through adult are welcome! This class fills up fast so register early!
